Public comments must be received no later than **11:59 PM on November 6, 2024**. Written comments are preferred and should be submitted in writing to the mailing address or e-mail address listed above. Brief Background

On February 14, 2024, Illinois EPA voluntarily entered into an Informal Resolution Agreement (IRA) with U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) to resolve a civil rights complaint concerning the Illinois EPA's issuance of an air construction permit for a metal shredder to be located on the Southeast Side of Chicago. Under the IRA, Illinois EPA committed to revising several of its plans and polices, including its current Language Access Plan.

The 2024 Draft Plan provides Agency employees with resources and a protocol for interacting with identified Limited English Proficiency (LEP) individuals including the availability of interpretation and translation services at no cost to the requestor. In addition, the plan reflects the Agency's policy that when individuals need language assistance to meaningfully participate in Illinois EPA's programs or events, opportunities for such assistance will be identified and pursued when circumstances meet the guidelines of this Plan. The 2024 Draft Plan strengthens Illinois EPA's commitment to ensuring the Agency meets its nondiscrimination obligations under applicable civil rights laws.
