Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) staff have reviewed the X-Ray Fluorescence (XRF) readings taken from Playfield Park, in Crestwood, IL on June 11, 2009.

It is our understanding that Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Illinois EPA) staff used an XRF device to determine lead levels underneath and near the Crestwood water tower. XRF readings were taken between the surface soil and three inches in depth.

The United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) has set a screening value of 400 parts per million (ppm) for lead in residential soil. All XRF readings were less than 400 ppm. Based on these results, IDPH does not believe that lead levels in Playfield Park pose a health hazard.
