List the sample site location IDs with lead above the action level:

- Attach the results of the water quality parameter sampling to this form. The sampling must be at a new water quality parameter sampling site that is on the same-sized water main, in the same pressure zone, and located within a half mile of the sampling site that exceeded the lead action level. The supplier must measure pH, Alkalinity, Orthophosphate (if applicable). A supplier with an existing water quality parameter sampling site complying with these criteria may sample from that site.
- Attach the results of the follow-up sample at any tap sampling site exceeding the lead action level. If the supplier cannot collect a follow-up sample at a site, provide justification.
