Notice of Informational Public Meeting
for
Illinois' Lead Rulemaking

The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency is preparing a new regulation to improve air quality in the two areas of the state that do not meet the federal standard for the amount of lead in the ambient air. One of the areas, the Granite City non-attainment area, is defined as Granite City Township and Venice Township. The Illinois EPA is required to design a plan to bring the area into attainment of the federal National Ambient Air Quality Standard for lead. This plan must be incorporated into Illinois' environmental regulations to become effective. The Illinois EPA has developed a draft regulation and will be submitting it to the Illinois Pollution Control Board (IPCB) to be codified in Illinois' regulations. Before submission to the IPCB, the Illinois EPA is holding an Informational Public Meeting to provide information and answer questions from the public about this action.
