The Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (IEPA) has made a tentative determination to terminate the NPDES permit for the above named discharger.

Discharge no(s):	002, 003, and 004
Type of Waste:	Non-Contact Cooling Water and Storm Water
Flow Rate:	0.432 MGD
Classification:	Secondary Contact and Indigenous Aquatic Life Waters
Receiving Waters:	North Branch - Chicago River

The Agency intends to terminate the permit because the discharger has changed locations and is no longer engaged in the manufacture of steel at the facility located at 2011 N. Southport Avenue, Chicago, Illinois 60614. All non-contact cooling water that was previously discharged was associated with the induction and remelt furnaces and will therefore no longer be discharged. The storm water is no longer considered to be associated with industrial activity as defined by Title 40 CFR §122.26(b)(14), and is therefore no longer required to be permitted.

Interested persons are invited to submit written comments to the IEPA at the above address. The NPDES permit and notice number(s) must appear on each comment page. Any interested person may submit a written request for a public hearing, stating his or her name and address, the nature of the issues proposed to be raised and the evidence proposed to be presented with regards to those issues.

The application, Public Notice/Fact Sheet, comments received, and other documents are available for inspection and may be copied at the IEPA between 9:30 a.m. and 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.

All comments on the intended termination of the permit and requests for hearing must be received by the IEPA not later than 30 days from the date of this publication. If written comments or requests indicate a significant degree of public interest, the permitting authority may, at its discretion, hold a public hearing.
