Illinois Environmental Protection Agency (Illinois EPA) Groundwater Section has reviewed the information provided in the August 1, 2019 People's Gas Light and Coke Company (PGL) Groundwater Monitoring Zone (GMZ) Application for Manlove Natural Gas Storage Field and the May 20, 2020 Response to IEPA Comments on the GMZ Application for Manlove Gas Storage Field.

The GMZ application was filed with the Agency on August 1, 2019. The GMZ application provided details on the following:

- Defined boundaries for the GMZ including horizontal and vertical.
- Defined Remedial Criteria as Class I Potable Resource Groundwater Standards.
- Summarized Remedial Actions completed:
 - Source Control measures including rehabilitation of MC2 and evaluation and maintenance of other wells at the site.
 - Monitoring and residential control measures including passive vent installation, bottled water, gas-water separators, and methane detectors.
 - Aquifer remediation including installing 3 gas relief wells in Mahomet Aquifer and shallow sands (have not been activated due to regulatory issues).
 - Additional remediation measures were proposed for the GMZ including using MC2 for venting, additional passive vents, methane detectors, additional gaswater separators, and notifications to local well drillers/IDPH coordination for IEPA-DIVISION OF RECORDS MANAGEMENT
- Remedial action to continue until remediation objectives are metRELEASABLE
 - Monitoring and residential control measures
 - Use of gas relief wells

Continued use of additional remediation measures

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The GMZ application did not provide remedial action alternatives. Illinois EPA provided comments on September 6, 2019 which included a request for high resolution figures and maps and an assessment of remedial alternatives.

After involvement with the Attorney General's Office to implement Section 31. PGL provided a response to comments on May 20, 2020 which included seven proposed actions to be performed to complete the GMZ application as follows:

- 1. Installation of relief wells in the four stratigraphic trap areas identified in the 3-D visualization and cross sections.
- 2. Securing of permits for existing relief wells.
- 3. More extensive monitoring and reporting on the new and existing monitoring wells.
- 4. Data collection from the new and existing monitoring wells.
- 5. Dedicated groundwater monitoring well network for the four stratigraphic trap areas.
- 6. Extensive sampling of the groundwater monitoring network with a minimum of eight samples per well, per month, for a year with quarterly sampling after one year.
- 7. Fate and transport model created from data collected.

The Groundwater Section conditionally approves the proposed GMZ with the following stipulations:

- 1. IEPA must approve specific locations of each well prior to installation of the well.
- 2. IEPA must approve the calculations of statistical analysis prior to the finalization of any reporting activities.
