





Proposal	Description	Projected Revenue
Increase IL distribution from Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act	Align IIJA funding with demonstrated state need.	\$1.23 billion
Additional Federal Appropriation	FY2023 \$1.5 billion appropriation for LSLR.	\$179M

	Description	Payer	Annual Projected Revenue - Low	Annual Projected Revenue - High
Per 1,000 gallon charge	A progressive surcharge applied for every 1,000 gallons of billed water.	Billed water customers	\$14.6 million	\$365 million
Monthly Infrastructure Improvement charge	A progressive surcharge for each water main connection.	Property owners	\$112.1 million	\$186.8 million
Bottled Water Charge	A set charge paid for every bottle of water sold.	Consumers of bottled water	\$35.8 million	\$107.5 million
