Contest Rules, Information, and Timetable

How Can You Slash Your Trash?

Theme: Thinking creatively on how to reduce the amount of trash you produce. This could include buying fewer single-use products; composting food waste; repairing broken items instead of replacing or buying new; and recycling items that cannot be re-used or repaired.

Participants: Illinois fifth and sixth grade students

Art guidelines:

- Art paper or poster board no smaller than 8-1/2" x 11" and no larger than 12" x 18"
- Markers, crayons, pens, pencils, paints, or graphics software (two-dimensional media only)
- Must be participant's own work

Poetry/Prose guidelines:

- One page maximum length, one-sided (no larger than 8-1/2" x 11" sheet)
- Neatly handwritten or typed; minimum 10-point font (must be readable)

Entries must be submitted electronically (word, pdf, jpeg, or tiff files). Please make sure to include the entire work in the photo with appropriate lighting to enhance the quality of the work.

The maximum number of entries per school is eight.

NOTE: Each student must submit a release form and entry ID with his or her work. Only one person per entry (no group projects).

Each student's work will be judged on:

- Understanding of the concept
- Originality of execution -- no magazine articles, commercial slogans or copyrighted characters or figures
- Clear, accurate message
- Emphasis on the theme
- Neatness/attractiveness, legibility/readability, correct spelling, punctuation, and grammar
- Effort put into the work

Submission Process for Teachers:

- Choose eight entries (four art and four written works) to represent your school
- Make sure completed identification forms are included
- Each entry must include a release form filled out and signed at the time of submission
- Entries must be emailed no later than February 3, 2025
- Email entries, ID and release forms (word, pdf, jpeg or tiff files) to: EPA.contest@illinois.gov

All entries become the property of the Illinois EPA and will be distributed for judging.

Awards:

Each participating student whose work meets the guidelines and requirements will receive a certificate. Finalists will receive a certificate, a ribbon, and an invitation to the awards ceremony in Springfield (subject to change). If needed, awards will be mailed to the teacher for distribution. Finalists include top winners, honorable mention, and special recognition. Twelve top winners (six in each category) will have their work displayed as such and receive an environmental reference book for their school's library.

Contest Timeline and Resources

January 2025 Educators introduce one or both of the Illinois EPA's curricula units on waste management (see below). Discuss the amount of garbage thrown away individually and collectively, why that causes problems, and how students can reduce the amount of trash thrown away. Students create posters or written works relating to the theme: January 13-24 How can you slash your trash? Teachers display posters and poems/prose at their schools. Students and January 27-31 faculty vote to select four posters and four written entries to submit to the Illinois EPA for further judging. February 3 Teachers submit up to eight entries per school to the Illinois EPA for judging Entries must be submitted electronically no later than February 3, 2025. February 2025 Judging Awards Ceremony held in Springfield April 5, 2025
