IEPA's Video Contest

Video Contest Rules:

- Length up to one minute (60 seconds) max; can include live filmed components, animations, text slides, etc.—be creative!
- Participation occurs on the <u>classroom/group level</u>. Groups can include homeschool units, 4-H clubs, scout troops, after-school clubs, etc.
- Each school classroom or group with a **minimum of five students** may submit <u>one</u> video for judging
- Participants must be in the 5th and/or 6th grade; teacher/adult will be main point of contact
- Videos are uploaded on YouTube; <u>entry form with link and consent form</u> must be submitted to: <u>EPA.contest@illinois.gov</u> no later than February 2, 2026
- Any inappropriate material will be automatically disqualified
- All work must be original and cannot contain copyrighted material, including background music
- Videos will be judged on their message, creativity, and originality
 Note: Winning videos will be used for Illinois EPA educational purposes and played on social media and posted on websites, etc.

Entries must engage with air quality strategies in accordance with this year's theme: "Together for Healthier Air!" thinking creatively on the many ways that everyone can help make a difference for healthier air both individually and community-wide and how to communicate those effectively.

Helpful Steps:

- Plan your script and props before you film
- Think about your cast: who/what will you show to communicate your message?
- Decide what kind of camera/phone you will use to record and practice filming
- Edit your project: programs like iMovie; Adobe Express; OpenShot, TikTok, and CapCut are all useful for editing
- Upload on YouTube (details here: https://www.youtube.com/creators)
- A positive and helpful/upbeat message is received better than a negative tone
- Focus should be on Illinois

Awards

- You could win recognition on social media and Illinois EPA's website
- The top three winner groups will receive classroom science kits and a group certificate
