Notes:

- Number of days, after receipt of the permit application, by which the Agency must be ready to take final action.
- Average number of days from the date the Agency receives the original application until the date the Agency issues the permit.
- The permit process for a Construction Permit, an Operating Permit, a Permit Renewal and a Major Permit Modification Request is a two step process: (1) a draft permit is first public noticed for public comment; (2) based upon the information received during the public comment period, a final permit is issued.
- A public hearing on the draft permit may be held if there is significant interest in the draft permit.
- Once a draft permit decision has been made by the Agency, local residents are notified of the decision and allowed to provide comments on the draft permit.
- UIC permits are only issued for a 10 year period. If the Permittee desires to operate the well for more than 10 years, then they must submit an application for a renewed permit.
