Equitable GI Network Development

Recommendations for Extension and Sea Grant Programming

- Formalize and fund an Extension Sea Grant Network
- Develop Green Infrastructure 201 programs for local government officials
- Further workforce development research and education focusing on GI careers, not jobs
- Develop decision support tools for communities
 - Cost-benefits
 - Lifecycle cost analysis
 - Planning tools that help decision-makers pick locations and practices
